The Department of Physics at Simon Fraser University invites applications for a temporary teaching position at the rank of Lecturer for a term from May 1, 2021 through April 30, 2022. The successful candidate will be expected to make a strong contribution to our undergraduate program in a variety of ways including coordinating undergraduate labs, teaching lecture and lab courses, training and mentoring teaching assistants, participating in outreach activities, and showing leadership in undergraduate physics education.

Workload for this position will be equivalent to primary instruction of 4 first-year undergraduate lecture and laboratory courses, with additional responsibilities including supporting primary instructors of large enrollment first-year lecture courses as a secondary instructor.

Minimum qualifications for this position are:

- A PhD in Physics;
- A strong commitment to and demonstrated talent for teaching and curriculum development at the undergraduate level, with a minimum of two years' experience as a physics instructor at the post-secondary level with duties including curriculum design and Teaching Assistant (TA) supervision;
- Demonstrated organizational and interpersonal abilities.

The ideal candidate will also have experience teaching in an on-line environment and working with Canvas and Zoom.

Applicants should apply electronically by sending a cover letter and CV, a statement of teaching experience and philosophy, and the names and email addresses of at least three individuals who will be able to comment on their teaching excellence to Barbara Frisken, Chair, Department of Physics, at physchr@sfu.ca by March 30, 2021.

All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadian citizens and permanent residents will be given priority.
